### End of Semester Reminders

#### Package Pick-Up

**The last day to pick up packages for the Fall Semester is TODAY, Friday, December 15, 2023.** Packages that are not picked up will be sent back to the sender. Residents are encouraged to plan ahead.

**Fall meal plans will end with dinner this Sunday, December 17, 2023.** Any unused meal swipes are forfeited at the end of the semester and **do not** roll over to the Spring semester however, meal points **do** roll over to the Spring semester. #### Winter Break Housing Closure Reminder

Residential buildings will be closed beginning **Sunday, December 17, 2023, at 5 PM** and will re-open to residents on **Friday, January 19, 2024, at 10 AM**. This closure will include all the residential buildings. Housing residents will not have access to the building or suite/room during this time period.

**Please Note:** Residents **DO NOT** have to take belongings home during the Winter Break (except any valuables).

#### Reminders

- University Housing staff will be entering ALL resident rooms, including those occupied, for facility and safety purposes.
  - Close AND lock ALL bedroom doors, windows and sliders.
  - Unplug all electronic devices (alarm clocks, computers, etc.) and turn off AC.
  - Remove all trash, perishable items and food from refrigerators.
  - Unplug and defrost your personal, mini-fridge. The refrigerator should be placed properly on drip tray to prevent damage.
  - Take home and secure all valuables (including room keys).
  - Remember to take home any medication and other needed items during the break.
  - Continuously check your CPP email throughout the break for any university/UHS updates.

## Bicycle Reminders & Security Tips

## Protect Your Bike: Register your bike with UPD & Sign Up for the UHS bike storage.

Cal Poly Pomona is committed to supporting the needs of cyclists on campus. Bicycle security is a priority for Cal Poly Pomona, and there are several measures you can take to prevent bicycle theft. By adhering to following the guidelines, you can optimize the security of your bicycle.

1. **Use Designated Bike Racks:** Avoid theft by utilizing permanent, fixed anchored bike racks located around campus. Refrain from securing your bike to small trees, handrails, posts, benches or chain-link fences. You can find a map of designated bike rack locations [here](insert link).
2. **Always Lock Your Bike:** Whether you are storing your bike in a garage, residence hall room, apartment, or briefly leaving it unattended, utilizing a lock is imperative.
3. **Choose a U-Shaped High-Security Lock:** Opt for a good quality, sturdy U-lock for enhanced protection, as lightweight cable or chain locks may not provide sufficient security and can be easily cut. For added security, consider using both types of locks.
4. **Properly Attached and Secure the Lock:** Maximize security by positioning your bike frame and wheels to occupy as much open space within the U-portion of the lock as possible. A tighter lock-up makes it more challenging for thieves to use a pry bar and open the lock.
5. **Secure Components and Accessories:** Pay special attention to components that can be easily removed, such as quick-release wheels or seats. Bike shops offer security devices for added protection.

## Bicycle Registration:

Registering your bicycle at Cal Poly Pomona is a crucial step in safeguarding your bike, identifying your bike, and deterring theft. The following are benefits to registering your bike:

1. **Deterrent to Theft:** Having your bike's serial number on file makes it more challenging for thieves to resell.
2. **Proof of Ownership:** In case you forget your lock combination or lose your key, having your bike registered serves as proof of ownership when requesting for a bike lock removal. CPP UPD will be unable to cut a bicycle lock unless ownership can be proven.
3. **Recovery if Stolen:** In the unfortunate event of loss or theft, registered bikes have a higher likelihood of being returned if located.

## UHS Bike Storage:

UHS Bike Storage is located on the exterior of Sicomoro Hall (Building 73) and Secoya Hall (Building 74). Submission of form does not guarantee Bike Storage Access. Due to space limitations, students will be chosen through a random lottery. Selected residents will be notified via CPP Email. Bike Storage is for Residence Hall and Suites Students Only.
